share more information with you about their day. (Or at least to hopefully get more than yes/no answers(:)

- Who did you play with at recess?
- What did you play?
- Who did you sit with at lunch time?
- What books did you read today? What were they about?
- What books did your teacher read today? What were they about?
- What types of math did you talk about today?
- How many Reading Counts points do you have?
- What was the BEST part of your day at school?
- What was the lowest/worst part of your day at school?
- What are you writing about this week?
- What was something funny that happened today?
- What made you laugh today?
- What mistakes did you make today?
